
# LEVEL 3 DIPLOMA IN WORK-BASED FENCING

## Expectations at level 3

Achievement at level 3 reflects the ability to identify and use relevant understanding, methods and skills to complete tasks and address problems that, while well defined, have a measure of complexity. It includes taking responsibility for initiating and completing tasks and procedures as well as exercising autonomy and judgement within limited parameters. It also reflects awareness of different perspectives or approaches within an area of study or work.

#### Introduction

This qualification is a competencybased qualification and is based on the Fencing National Occupational Standards. This qualification is aimed at those who are involved in a variety of fencing roles (general fencing and vehicle restraint systems) and is suitable for those who are working in a technical role or supervisory/management level.

### Structure

This qualification has nine mandatory units. All units must be achieved to gain the qualification.
